<p>The Bachelor of Applied Social Science (Community Service) is three years in duration for a full time student, or six years duration for a part time student. In this course, your core subjects will comprise of 21 subjects. Each year consists of three Study Periods, also known as Trimesters.</p> <p>Core subjects - compulsory subjects that you must complete</p> <p>Elective subjects - subjects you can choose between from the Elective Bank below</p> <p>This course comprises of 24 subjects that you are required to complete: 21 core subjects and 3 elective subjects.</p> <p>The course contains 3 subject levels - Level 100, 200 and 300, guiding you from foundational through to more complex subjects.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Level 100: 8 core subjects • Level 200: 7 core subjects + 1 elective • Level 300: 6 core subject + 2 electives <p>Not all subjects run each Study Period. If your suggested subjects are unavailable, we encourage you to take the immediate preceding or following subject(s) where possible. Please refer to the notes below regarding compulsory on-campus workshops.</p> <p>Prerequisite subject - a subject you must complete before undertaking another subject</p> <p>*The FLD201A subject is taken in the final trimester of year 2 and FLD301A subject is taken in the final trimester of year 3 of the Bachelor of Applied Social Science (Community Services) course. ** If you are applying for ACWA Skills Assessment after completion of your studies you will need to ensure your placements follow this study plan.</p>	
<p>How to read the below Suggested Study Pattern (as a Full Time Student):</p> <p>8 subjects per year make up a full time study load, following a 3 subjects-3 subjects-2 subjects pattern across the year's three Study Periods (Trimesters). As an example: Following the below pattern, the subjects in your first year would be: Your first Study Period: COU101A, COU102A and COU103A (3 subjects) Your second Study Period: COU104A, SOC102A and SOC103A (3 subjects) Your third Study Period: WEL101A and WEL102A (2 subjects)</p> <p>Studying Part Time? You would still follow the below sequence from top to bottom, but with fewer subjects per study period.</p> <p>*The FLD201A subject is taken in the final trimester of year 2 and FLD301A subject is taken in the final trimester of year 3 of the Bachelor of Applied Social Science (Community Services) course. ** If you are applying for ACWA Skills Assessment after completion of your studies you will need to ensure your placements follow this study plan.</p>

Students are required to engage in community service work in these placements working alongside other professionals.
