

BACH_APH Bachelor of Applied Public Health

The Bachelor of Applied Public Health is three years in duration for a full time student, or six years duration for a part time student. In this course, your core and specialisation subjects will comprise of 16 subjects. Each year consists of three Study Periods, also known as Trimesters.

Core and Specialisation subjects - compulsory subjects that you must complete
Elective subjects - subjects you can choose between from the Elective Bank below

This course comprises of 24 subjects that you are required to complete: 8 core subjects + 8 specialisation and 8 elective subjects.

Prerequisite subject - a subject you must complete before undertaking another subject

RPL - Should you have any Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) credits that make you eligible for exemptions, please contact your Program Director to discuss further.

Please note: Not all subjects run each Study Period. If your suggested subjects are unavailable, we encourage you to take the immediate preceding or following subject(s) where possible.

Note that as part of Australian visa requirements, international students must complete at least 75% of their course as face to face delivery, and thus can only complete 6 subjects online for the BAPH

—there are currently two subjects proposed in online mode:

1 Core: Introduction to Social Research Methods SOC202A

1 Specialisation: Nutrition and Society NUTR2003

International students must choose 4 electives in Face to Face mode

How to read the below Suggested Study Pattern (as a Full Time Student):

8 subjects per year make up a full time study load, following a **3 subjects-3 subjects-2 subjects** pattern across the year's three Study Periods (Trimesters).

As an example: Following the below pattern, the subjects in your first year would be:

Your first Study Period: PUBH2000, PUBH2101, Elective (3 subjects)

Your second Study Period: PUBH2102, PUBH2103, Elective (3 subjects)

Your third Study Period: PUBH2011, PUBH2101 (2 subjects)
