Master of Global Project Management (Advanced)

The Master of Global Project Management (Advanced) course is 2 years in duration for a full-time student. Each year consists of three Study Periods, also known as Trimesters.
Core subject - a compulsory subject that you must complete
Elective subject - a subject you must choose from the Elective Bank below
Pre-requisite subject - a subject you must complete before undertaking another subject
This course comprises 16 subjects that you are required to complete: 10 core subjects and 6 elective subjects
RPL - Should you have any Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) credits that make you eligible for exemptions, please contact your Program Director to discuss further.

How to read the below Suggested Study Pattern (as a Full-Time Student):

8 subjects per year make up a full-time study load, following a **3 subjects - 3 subjects - 2 subjects** pattern across the year's three main Trimesters. **As an example:** Following the below pattern, the subjects in **your first year** would be:

Your first Study Period: MGT501, MGT502 and PROJ6000 (3 subjects)

Your second Study Period: PROJ6002, PROJ6003, PROJ6004 (3 subjects)

Your third Study Period: PROJ6017 and MGT600 (2 subjects)

Studying Part-Time? You would still follow the below sequence from top to bottom, but with fewer subjects per Study Period.

Fast-Track? You can complete your course sooner by taking up to 4 subjects in each trimester.
